This update is to alert you that on Tuesday, June 23rd, we learned that a Greensburg campus dietary worker has tested positive for COVID-19. We believe that contact with others, especially our residents, was low. We have begun contact tracing of those residents or employees who may have come in contact with this person. If we believe that you have had any risk of contact, you will hear from us about being tested. If you do not hear from us, you may assume that you did not have contact with this employee and will not be in need of testing.

We continue to encourage best practices for infection control. Wear your masks, covering your mouth and nose. Wash your hands frequently. Practice your best social distancing by maintaining that six feet “bubble” around yourself at all times.

We have done an exceptional job of keeping COVID-19 out of our buildings. This case is of course concerning, but reflective of what we are seeing throughout our nation as we return to “normal” life and have more possibilities for exposure to the virus. Our prayers are with this employee and others who are directly impacted by the virus.
